






INTRODUCTION FROM THE EDITOR-

The specter of dispassion and the specter of hate consume the logic of those such possessed.


There is real and grave danger that could be stopped with the right muster.


But instead these folks would rather their homes be cleaved in twine.


By the disasters that will come to pass in a short due time. Still my kin will love even if far from home.


HELP US GROW A BETTER COMMUNITY: GET INVOLVEDI



Rebecca: Absurdist Comedy


Everyone loves to reference Scrooge McDuck diving into a swimming pool of gold coins but what you don't know is what happened behind the scenes.
