The Aspirnaut[™] Program invites you to apply for the Summer 2022 Berea/Aspirnaut[™] Hal Moses Summer Research Internships. Aspirnaut[™] is a K-20 STEM pipeline for diversity at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC). **More information can be found on our website: www.aspirnaut.org.**

Students spend **ten weeks** in a research experience as a member of a team of scientists, conducting research, presenting findings in oral and poster presentation sessions, and engaging in professional and personal skills development.

Each participant receives a stipend from Berea College. The Aspirnaut™ program will provide double-occupancy room and board (\$15.00 per day) for the student.

Eligibility Criteria

- Applicants must be enrolled at Berea College majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, or Physics.
- Students considered for this program will be those who have achieved excellent grades in math and science courses and who have demonstrated a commitment to pursuing a career in a STEM field (science, technology, engineering, or mathematics).
- Students must have valid, current health insurance at the start of and for the duration of the program.

In addition to the application, we require the following:

- Official transcript with the most recent semester's final grades displayed
- Two (2) letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a math/science faculty
