

Pre-Medical/Dental Undergraduate Timeline Sophomore Year

Focus your career path.

Keep focused on your academic coursework.

Course expectations will be increasing as you progress through your major and general education program.

Decide and declare your major.

As a pre-professional student, you can major in any area of interest. Major in a field that you like and that interests you the most. You'll likely perform the best academically in an area you enjoy. You will just need to make sure to complete any of the necessary pre-professional prerequisite courses if they are not part of your major coursework. (SPRING TERM)

Continue to volunteer.

Many opportunities are available through the CELTS program as well as others through religious organizations, social service agencies, long term care facilities, hospitals, etc. (FALL/SPRING)

Consider shadowing a physician or dentist

during holiday breaks or during the summer break as part of a formal internship. Be sure to attend the internship information sessions offered by the Internship Office if you are considering a summer internship. A lot of planning and some paperwork is involved. Don't wait till the last minute. (start planning FALL TERM)

Investigate summer research opportunities.

Discuss opportunities with your advisor, talk to other professors, watch for posted announcements, search the web, etc. (start planning FALL TERM)

 Investigate and review information about the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT)

if you are following a pre-med track. Its not too early to acquaint yourself with the topics covered on the exam and the exam format.
