ACT Alumni Survey Results

Two years after graduation, Berea alumni receive a national survey instrument that asks about the contribution of the College to a wide range of learning goals. Berea graduates rate their learning above the national averages on all items.

Areas of particular strength are illustrated in the chart to the left.

Of Berea graduates, $70 \%$ compared to only $31 \%$ of their peers from other private four-year colleges, indicated that they were exceptionally well prepared to continue their education.

Also, Berea graduates were much more likely to indicate that they would attend



Berea College again if they could start college over. Seventy-one percent of Berea graduates say they would "definitely" re-attend the College if they had to do it over again versus only $42 \%$ of their national peers.

Nearly two thirds of the Berea respondents indicated they were working full-time, while about $3 \%$ were self employed. Five percent of graduates were continuing their education, and $6 \%$ were employed and continuing their education. About 5\% were unemployed while others were caring for family, in the military, or did not indicate what they were currently doing.
