




All Students Berea College vs. Four-Year Private Institutions Satisfaction Ratings within Item Group: Safety and Security

Black/African-American Students Berea College vs. Four-Year Private Institutions Satisfaction Ratings within Item Group: Safety and Security





Male Students Berea College vs. Four-Year Private Institutions Satisfaction Ratings within Item Group: Safety and Security







International Students Importance and Satisfaction Ratings within Item Group: Residential/Campus Life Graph 1 of 2









(Spring 2005 Follow-Up to the Fall 2004 CIRP)












Campus response to needs of physically challenged individuals

General condition of building and grounds


