It has been a year since Mikheil started working as an IT-TA. He has been actively involved in peer assisted learning, faculty assistance, and technical support. Projects he has implemented include creating the learning modules for the use of technology and assisting faculty with incorporation of the academic electronic health records into their courses. In addition, the IT-TA has been involved in helping faculty with development of simulation programs of learning with barcode scanner technology for medication administration.

As an IT-TA, Mikheil has participated at various conferences, sharing the benefits of this position with faculty and students from across the United States. He was given the opportunity to network with members of the American Nursing Informatics Association (ANIA) and gain membership into this prestigious organization, representing our student body. The Berea College Nursing Program is unique in utilizing an undergraduate nursing student as an IT-TA. No literature mentions students working as IT-TAs. This is where the integration of work and education come together, leading to student opportunities.

The IT-TA student laborer will be involved in the future development of technology as a learning tool at Berea College. After Mikheil Matcharadze graduates in May of 2014, Nicholas Cress, a rising senior nursing student, will take the role of the IT-TA and continue to promote knowledge, skills and attitudes of nursing students through the use of technology.
