


# **Kentucky Organ Donor Affiliates**

#### Work College's Consortium Grant

Teresa Villaran received a grant from the Work College's Consortium to create and implement a new labor position within the program of nursing. This grant will help develop an Information Technology Teaching Assistant (IT-TA) needed to help students and faculty understand the importance of technology in health, as well as help promote the use of technology in the classrooms. The first student in this position is Mikheil Matcharadze. Please congratulate Mikheil on his position. This is an extension of his contribution in the Summer 2012, with Teresa Villaran, Gilbert Bangha and Alison York, in their work, "Incorporating an Electronic health record into an undergraduate nursing program." We look forward to developing this role as we implement a simulation program into the nursing curriculum. This student laborer will be instrumental in the development and growth of technology as a teaching tool within nursing.



SimChart is a web based simulated documentation system we incorporated across the curriculum this year. Student experience with documenting in an EHR was varied or absent, within the clinical settings. This software gives all of our students the needed experience, and has the added feature of being adaptable within a simulation program of learning.
