














Students responded to these six mental health questions, and each response was scored from 0 to 4.

The table on the left shows the highest averages at this school. Higher averages imply that more students are experiencing this issue.

Number of Students by Mental Health Score





Students responded to six mental health questions, and each response was scored from 0 to 4. Responding "None of the time" equaled 0, and then "All of the time" equaled 0. Students will score from 0-24 with higher scores reflecting greater mental health distress.

For example, a student that responded "None of the time" on all six questions would score a zero. A student that responded "All of the time" on all six questions would score twenty-four. The National Center for Health Statistics reports that a score of 13+ could imply serious mental illness.

From the 1,220 respondents to this question there were **202 students who scored higher** than the thirteen, which implies that 16.6% of respondents could be experiencing serious mental illness or distress at the time of the survey.




Is your home internet adequate for online learning?







How many bars of cell service does your phone have at your house?














