Students responded to six mental health questions, and each response was scored from 0 to 4. Responding "None of the time" equaled 0 , and then "All of the time" equaled 0 . Students will score from $0-$ 24 with higher scores reflecting greater mental health distress.

For example, a student that responded "None of the time" on all six questions would score a zero. A student that responded "All of the time" on all six questions would score twenty-four. The National Center for Health Statistics reports that a score of 13+ could imply serious mental illness.

From the 1,220 respondents to this question there were 202 students who scored higher than the thirteen, which implies that $16.6 \%$ of respondents could be experiencing serious mental illness or distress at the time of the survey.
