

2018-2019 DIGITAL MEDIA MINOR

The Digital Media minor contributes to (1) a student's training in the practices of digital media production, (2) the development of critical thinking and creative skills that can be applied in a variety of professional environments and disciplines, and (3) serves as a formal credential for students interested in pursuing digital media production professions. Students may gain skills in website design, photo editing, animation, and video production. Critical thinking and technical skills are engaged to produce digital media content and distribute that content across multiple platforms. Students will gain proficiency in applied communication, learning methods and strategies increasing the impact of their intended messages.

Please note that at least three of the following courses must be from outside the student's major. As many of these courses are in sequence, it is highly recommended that students complete the survey courses before their production courses.
