Asian Studies is a multidisciplinary approach to studying the cultures of Asia. The Asian Studies Department draws upon courses from a number of other academic departments that focus for a significant part of the academic term on one or more aspects, past and present, of these areas.

Students pursuing an Asian Studies minor will meet regularly with the Chair of Asian Studies, but maintain their current major adviser(s). The College also offers a B.A. Degree with a Major in Asian Studies.
