

2020-2021 FOREST RESOURCE MANAGEMENT (FOR) MINOR

(Minimum of seven course credits)

The curriculum for the Forest Resource Management minor is an interdisciplinary minor which combines a foundation of classes in ANR and BIO with distribution courses that can be selected to provide focus in wildlife, natural resources, wood utilization, or management. The minor will consist of 7 course credits. No more than four courses can count both toward a student's major and the FOR minor, and no more than three courses can count both toward a different minor and the FOR minor.
