BEREA COLLEGE REGISTRATION FOR CURRENT STUDENTS FOR FALL TERM, 2022 April 11-20, 2022

We hope you are ready to register for another term at Berea. Please arrange to meet with your advisor between Monday, March 28 and Friday, April 8 to plan your schedule. You should include alternate courses in the event your preferred courses are not available at the time of registration.

COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURES IN THE ORDER GIVEN FOR REGISTRATION:

- 1. Contact your academic advisor for an appointment to plan your academic program.
- 2. You are expected to do preliminary planning of your schedule prior to your meeting with your advisor. Also, be prepared to discuss with your advisor your future career plans and how you are currently progressing. Please bring a copy of your degree audit (listed as Degree Evaluation) along with other relevant materials with you to the appointment with your advisor.
- 3. After your schedule(s) is completed, your advisor will give you an alternate PIN (which is a Personal Identification Number to use for registration only). This PIN is equivalent to the advisor's signature and indicates that the two of you have met and completed the schedule planning process. You will be asked for your Alternate Pin after you go in to the Registration screens. Please take care not to misplace this important part of your registration information only your advisor can give it to you again. The Office of the Registrar will not provide a student with their PIN during the initial registration period.
- 4. Use your alternate PIN to begin your registration on myBerea according to the schedule below. (You will not be able to register until your scheduled time.) The Web registration screens provide instructions on how to proceed with registration.
- 5. Please be aware that your labor contract for fall must be completed prior to registration.

ORDER OF REGISTRATION

Registration day and time is determined by the number of credits you have earned (does not include the credits for which you are currently enrolled). Please check the menu on myBerea for the section "Check your Registration Status" to view your assigned time for registration. This will also give you access to see if you have any holds that would prevent your registration (Emergency Contact Information Update, Financial Aid, Student Payroll, Student Accounts). Any holds will need to be cleared through the office that placed the hold on your record before you can register.

CLOSED CLASSES, COURSE TIME CONFLICTS, PREREQUISITES

You will not be required to get the signature of your advisor if you encounter closed classes, have a course time conflict, or if you have problems with prerequisites. Instead, please contact the instructor of the course. If you are given permission to enroll in the course, that instructor will process the override and you must then register for the course by going back to the Web Registration page in myBerea.

INTERNSHIP AND INDEPENDENT STUDY

To register for any Internship, you must submit the appropriate application materials with required signatures to the Internship Office. Be sure you are aware of deadlines. The Internship Office will submit a list of the approved internships to the Office of the Registrar (116 Lincoln Hall) for registration processing.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES FOR APPLIED MUSIC (PRIVATE LESSONS)

You will sign up for these courses in the Music Building (Presser Hall) at the beginning of the Fall and Spring terms. The Registrar will register you for these courses once the list of students is complete.

CHANGE OF PROGRAM (DROPPING/ADDING COURSES)

You will be permitted to drop-add, without fee, anytime between the time you register and Tuesday, August 24, 2022 by Web Registration. After these dates, you are not permitted to add a course. To withdraw from a course, you will need to process an electronic <u>drop form</u> from the Registrar's Forms Page with your advisor's signature. Any course withdrawals after August 24, 2022 will be assigned a withdrawal grade.

POLICY REGARDING COURSES DROPPED

Courses dropped during official registration periods or the date posted on the Fall Academic Calendar will not be reflected on the permanent record. The letter "W" (withdrawn) will be used to indicate courses dropped during the time indicated to withdraw from a course with a grade of W on the academic calendar. You may withdraw from a course during the time indicated to receive a WP or WF on the academic calendar and your instructor will be asked to indicate the quality of any completed work to that point with a "WP" (withdrawn passing) or a "WF" (withdrawn failing). No course may be dropped during the final seven weeks of the term. WP/WF will not be counted in calculating the GPA. (See calendar above for official drop/withdrawal dates.)

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Students planning to complete requirements for teacher certification must follow the guidelines given in "Program for Preparation for Teachers" in the Berea College Catalog.

COURSE FEES

Course fees, shown in the Schedule of Classes and in the current Berea College Catalog, are charged to the student's account. The fee is automatically charged upon registration for the course. The student's account is credited if the course is dropped by the end of the first week of class as indicated in the official College calendar.

SCHEDULE OF CLASS HOURS

Letters following course numbers (A, B, C, etc.) indicate sections of the same course. Letters attached to the course (i.e., 186A) indicate a specialized topic. The time of the class meeting is indicated by CLOCK hours, (e.g., 0800 is 8:00 am, 1000 for 10:00 am, 0100 for 1:00 pm). The days of class meetings are indicated as follows: M=Monday, T=Tuesday, W=Wednesday, R=Thursday, F=Friday, Saturday=ST.

CONVOCATION CREDIT

All students will automatically be enrolled in a .25 credit convocation course (CNV 100) during each of their regular terms of enrollment, with the exception of the final term of enrollment, for a maximum of eight such terms. For each term of enrollment in CNV 100, the student will earn a grade of CA (which is calculated as an A in the GPA) for attending at least seven convocations. The grade of CF (which is calculated as an F in the GPA) will be awarded for attendance at fewer than seven convocations. Enrollment in this course is optional during the final term at Berea and is prohibited if the student has already enrolled in this course eight terms.

BEREA COLLEGE BUILDLING ABBREVIATIONS

IMPORTANT

Course Loads: The Maximum course credit load is 4.5 for all full-time students. Requests for course overloads can be made by the student by completing an Overload Form which is available on the forms page of the Registrar's webpage. Overloads will be added to the student schedule after the necessary approval signatures are collected electronically.

Underloads: For degree candidates, all class underloads (less than 3 credits) must have prior approval of the Student Admission and Academic Standing Committee. Requests for course underloads should be submitted to the Office of Academic Services (110 Lincoln Hall).

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Students will be placed on Academic Probation at the end of any regular term for failure to maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) or meet the credits requirement identified in the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) chart listed in the College Catalog (http://catalog.berea.edu/Current/Catalog).

Students who are deficient in meeting the SAP requirements may make up the deficiency during the Summer Term at Berea College or another regionally accredited institution. If credit is to be earned elsewhere, permission must be secured by completing the Application for Transfer Credit form prior to enrollment.

Fall 2022 Special Topics Course Descriptions

AFR 286 JK - Black and Indigenous Appalachia

This course explores social, political, economic, cultural experiences, and interactions of African Americans and Indigenous Peoples in Appalachia from the beginning of European invasion and settlement to the contemporary era. The course engages students in developing an understanding of the historical experiences of African Americans and Indigenous communities in Appalachia.

APS 286 JK - Black and Indigenous Appalachia

This course explores social, political, economic, cultural experiences, and interactions of African Americans and Indigenous Peoples in Appalachia from the beginning of European invasion and settlement to the contemporary era. The course engages students in developing an understanding of the historical experiences of African Americans and Indigenous communities in Appalachia.

ARH 286 TS - Medieval Manuscripts & Calligraphy

The medieval period was the great age of the handwritten book. Writing was a valuable, specialized, and artistic skill, and its use helped shape the development of medieval culture and institutions. In this course we will explore the role of books and writing in the Middle Ages by examining writing styles (scripts and hands), manuscript artwork, and bookmaking techniques. Through art historical analysis, we will study manuscript artwork, including illuminations, initials, miniatures, and marginalia. We will also participate in the work of the scribe by learning and using medieval calligraphic scripts together with some medieval concepts of layout, design, and decoration using dip pens, ink, and paint to create works of calligraphic art. Related to ancient and medieval scribal work, we will also develop rudimentary skill in Latin palaeography and practice transcription from medieval manuscript texts, noting how palaeography and calligraphy combine to enhance both skill sets. *Note: course requires purchase of materials.*

BUS 386 PC – Securities Analysis & Valuation

This course focuses on the process of equity security analysis credit evaluation, and corporate valuation. Questions concerning Comparative Risk Analysis, Investment Process, and Capital Allocation serve as the backdrop for evaluating and projecting corporate cash flow, conducting macroeconomic and industry analysis, employing technical and fundamental analysis, all the while developing the tools required for substantive investment recommendations.

CFS 186 JP - Healthy Cooking

Students will engage in the study of food across nutrition, culinary arts (specifically heathy cooking techniques), money management and planet sustainability. The course aims to improve knowledge around the relationships between our health, our food and food preparation, our planet, budgets and food access.

CFS 186 DP - The Meaning of Adulthood

Rites of passage may mark an individual as an adult in a particular culture, but that might only be the beginning of the transition to being recognized as an adult by family and the government. At 18 you can vote, but not buy alcohol. In some cases you can stay on your parent's insurance until you are 26 years old. So, when are you an adult, and what does that mean? Becoming an adult is a developmental process impacted by family, society and cultural influences.

COM 286 LS - Environmental Communication (SENS)

Journalists, government officials, corporate/environmental advocacy groups, concerned community members, among many others, make and respond to communication about the environment. However, what "environment" signifies and the stakes for engaging in sustainable practices are ambiguous and often contested.

CSC 186 DW - Intro to Web Development

CSC186 Introduction to Web Development acquaints students with creative web development. Students will explore the general history and behind-the-scenes of the world-wide web. Each small group of students will propose, design, and implement a website to promote a community organization or event. Their websites will separate structure, presentation, and interaction using standards-based HTML, CSS, and JavaScript respectively.

CSC 186 DW2 - Intro to Web Development

CSC186 Introduction to Web Development acquaints students with creative web development. Students will explore the general history and behind-the-scenes of the world-wide web. Each small group of students will propose, design, and implement a website to promote a community organization or event. Their websites will separate structure, presentation, and interaction using standards-based HTML, CSS, and JavaScript respectively.

ECO 386 VG - Game Theory

This course introduces game theory and applies it to topics in economics and related fields. Students will be introduced to cooperative and non-cooperative, simultaneous and sequential as well as perfect and imperfect information games.

EDS 186 JB - Inquiry into Social Studies Essentials

This course is one that focuses on key social studies skills and content. While the course is offered to students who are pursuing a career in history or social studies education, it can serve as an opportunity for non-Education majors to broaden their understanding of the world around them. Students can expect discussion topics such as geography, world cultures, economics, psychology, sociology.

FRN 186 RM - African, Caribbean, & Asian Culture

Taught in English, this course will explore the contemporary cultures of most of the forty French-speaking countries, regions, islands, etc. in Africa, the Caribbean, and Asia. We will watch and analyze films to learn about the cultures and recent histories of these places. Topics will include food, music, fashion, relationships, education, work, health, development, immigration, conflict, corruption, exploitation, climate change, class, gender, and religion.

GEO 386 HP – Hydrology

This class will cover the basic theories and applications of surface water flow, unsaturated flow, groundwater flow, and aqueous geochemistry. Applications include environmental analysis, agriculture, and industrial processes.

HIS 286 JK - Black and Indigenous Appalachia

This course explores social, political, economic, cultural experiences, and interactions of African Americans and Indigenous Peoples in Appalachia from the beginning of European invasion and settlement to the contemporary era. The course engages students in developing an understanding of the historical experiences of African Americans and Indigenous communities in Appalachia.

LES 386 DH - Legal Reasoning and Advocacy II

Students will explore a complex case problem designed to simulate the appeal of a proceeding via a writ of certiorari to the Supreme Court of the United States. Students will learn the case law spanning a large number of real- world legal opinions, while drafting and submitting formal case summaries and a legal brief prior to orally presenting their cases. Students will argue both side of the case in various "practice panel" simulations.

PSC 286 CP – Inter-American Relations

Is Latin America a useful concept to understand the international relations of the Americas? What is the role of the United States in Latin America? What are the main issues facing Latin American countries? This course attempts to answer these questions by examining inter-American relations from the perspective of regional subsystems.

SENS 286 LS - Environmental Communication (COM)

Journalists, government officials, corporate/environmental advocacy groups, concerned community members, among many others, make and respond to communication about the environment. However, what "environment" signifies and the stakes for engaging in sustainable practices are ambiguous and often contested.

SENS 386 HP - Hydrology

This class will cover the basic theories and applications of surface water flow, unsaturated flow, groundwater flow, and aqueous geochemistry. Applications include environmental analysis, agriculture, and industrial processes.

SOC 286 AW - Civic Engagement and Social Change

An introduction to civic engagement and social change for students interested in applying knowledge from their academic disciplines to contemporary issues and community contexts. The course examines trends in civic engagement over time, including forms it has taken and problems and potential associated with these. Social change theories and strategies are studied through the lens of personal and place-based narratives and case studies at the local, state, and national levels. Through an applied project, students will engage with community leaders and organizations involved in place-based development, outreach, and change. Students will also explore and reflect upon the intersections of self, organizations, and communities. While the course will emphasize civic engagement examples and themes based in the United States, it offers a framework for considering connections with international contexts and communities.

WGS 286 - Queer and Trans Studies

We will read articles from Sandy Stone, Susan Stryker, Cathy Cohen, C. Riley Snorton, Eli Clare and many other prominent scholars within queer and trans studies who think about how non-normative articulations of gender and sexuality intersect with race, class, ability, region, etc. We will also consider how queer and trans studies diverge as independent fields of thought, as well as how they complement each other, through close readings of these works.

Fall 2022 Art/Art History Topics Course Descriptions

ART 200C - Introduction to Ceramics

Clay as an expressive artistic medium is tactile, visceral, and responsive to touch. We can find it almost everywhere in the natural environment, all over the globe. As a product, it has a rich history that reaches back beyond recorded time with a dazzlingly wide array of potential uses. Slips and glazes are good resources for adding color and visual depth to your clay work. Like clay, glazes have a rich and varied history in their practical use and artistic expression.

This course is designed to introduce beginning through intermediate ceramic students to an in-depth use of clay as a tool for functional expression and as instruction in the use of glaze and slip decorating techniques. In this course, beginning students will be asked to construct a series of projects using wheel and rudimentary hand-building processes. Intermediate students will be asked to create a series of projects exploring personal expression and how those themes intersect with functional and sculptural Ceramics.

Fall 2022 English Topics Course Descriptions

ENG 205/305: No Time for Tears: Friendships between Black and White Women

Turn on any news program or pick up any major newspaper within the past few years and you'll see an article about the racial machinations of a "Karen," a "Becky," or even an "Amy". These are White women who call the police on presumably misbehaving Black and brown citizens. While many Americans have been shocked and surprised by the ease with which these white women readily call upon the state to discipline Black and brown bodies, others know differently because these actions are part of long history of White women choosing themselves over and against other women, particularly Black women. In this course, we will explore the fraught socio-political history of Black women's relationships with White women in African American literature and history.

ENG 210 / 310: Chaucer in Context

Geoffrey Chaucer has been called "the father of English poesy," and studying his works is considered by many to be absolutely necessary to an education in English literature. This course will explore who Chaucer was and why he's still being read. Chaucer, however, cannot be considered in isolation of the cultural context in which he worked, so we're also going to examine what was happening culturally, politically, and artistically during what one historian has called "the calamitous 14th century" and how people negotiated issues that we recognize today, such as gender/performance/identity, authority, conformity/nonconformity, and the place/practice of religion in contemporary society. As modern scholars, we will explore what it means to study the major authors of the Middle Ages and ask why, of the three, Chaucer is the most recognized. Where do

these texts stand in the study of English? How do we negotiate competing theories of interpretation? What is the editor's role in the study of medieval literature? We'll consider multiple answers to these questions. The Middle Ages are long gone, but our understanding of that era changes as we change.

ENG 240/340: The Strange Invention of Time

The "time" of modern, Western, capitalist, and colonial nations is a recent and strange invention, but one that invisibly shapes human thinking and experience. This time, measured by industry punch clocks, train schedules, and efficiency, threatens even today to overshadow or elbow out other "temporalities," other ways of being in time that nevertheless persist. Throughout the course, we'll ask what exactly time is, what it means for us as humans, and how and why it has been central as a culturally-specific theme and storytelling component through the ages, and especially for many contemporary Black and Indigenous North American authors and filmmakers from Ishmael Reed (Flight to Canada, 1976) to Toni Morrison ("The Future of Time," 1996), from Chris Eyre and Sherman Alexie (Smoke Signals, 1998) to Assinijaq (Three Thousand, 2017).

ENG 205/305: Ghosts, Shape-shifters, and Other Dark Matters: Black Atlantic Literatures

Ghosts. Zombies. Water-mamas. Metamorphoses. In this course we'll look at 20th and 21st century works of Black literature on either side of the Atlantic-- the US, Caribbean, West Africa-- that are often invested in these extraordinary often non-human forms. Why ghosts? Why spirits? Why zombies? In looking for strange shapes and forms, we can grapple bigger questions about African diasporic literary traditions: what are salient themes that continue to emerge in contemporary global Black literatures? How does the trauma and memory of transatlantic slavery and colonialism play out and continue to haunt Black Atlantic literatures, and how do Black writers who engage the past also orient themselves towards the future? What does the invocation of non-human forms in these novels have to do with the long history of denying the humanity and humanness of Black people?
